- 3. Should QMSU establish a dedicated Muslim-only prayer space while maintaining existing multi-faith provision?
- 4. Should QMSU release a clear and explicit statement recognising 'The continuing events in the Middle East' as the 'genocide in Gaza carried out by Israel and her American and Middle Eastern allies'?
- 5. Should QMSU provide a private space where Muslim women who wear the face veil can eat and take breaks comfortably? (Version 2)
- 6. Should QMSU ban fossil fuel, mining and arms companies from SU-organised events and campaign for QMUL to adopt an ethical careers policy?
- 7. Should QMSU release a clear statement on the crisis in Sudan and provide practical support, updates, and educational resources?
- 8. Should the university create short, certified academic skills modules (e.g., writing, research, presentations) accessible to all students?
